Gender based violence is soaring against the backdrop of extreme socioeconomic distress in many countries, and so in Jordan and Lebanon. This project developed a low-cost, women-led innovative digital online tool to inform on GBV, rights and offer a platform to access existing protection services to women and girls at risk. Rather than offering a special fancy designed application, the project developed, through a user-developed design, a simpler solution: the women themselves, GBV survivors in Jordan, choose a chat bot running on Facebook, an application which is widely used. https://www.facebook.com/ActionAidAR/videos/259060642786603/
